JUNE TIP OF THE MONTH

April through May your grass should be cut at two and one half inches high. Typically, this represents one third of the blade that is removed. It is up to you to determine whether your lawn should be cut every seven, five, or four days during the spring.

Everything depends on how much rain we get, as this stimulates plant growth. Towards the end of June, raise your blades up on your machine to create a three inch cut. Without irrigation, cutting should occur once every seven days. Grass clippings present no problem when left on the lawn, as long as it does not look unsightly, and you are performing a cut once per week. If your lawn did get out of control, just cut it twice, to mulch the grass clippings back into the turf. You will be saving space in the land fill by not bagging your grass. In mulching the clippings back into your lawn, this will add nitrogen to the turf. It's also a good idea to change direction of your mowing pattern. This will avoid turf compaction and tire ruts.
